
## **Adoption of November Board of Trustees' Minutes**

### **OCS** Report to the Board

- Leonard Goldberg, CEO
  - o Admission Department Update
    - New Hire Ayisha Gomez, Assistant Director of Student Recruitment and Enrollment. She will be working with Krystal Vazquez, Admissions Supervisor and Kevin Dunn, Director of Student Recruitment and Enrollment. Ayisha is fluent in English and Spanish and comes to OCS from University Prep Public Schools, most recently, and Williamsburg Charter High School where she has experience in student recruitment, social media marketing, family and community engagement and enrollment management.

    - Sub-Committee Formation to be discussed further at the January Board meeting.
  - OCS School Happenings, Joanne Hazel, Middle School Principal & Interim High School Principal

- Sports Program Update

- MAP Testing Data Analysis, Sade McCaw, Deputy Head of School
  - These are nationally normed assessments that we use for Math and English. MAP Growth Assessments allow us to see individual growth projections and determines students' strengths and areas of growth for each standard. Students are assessed three times a year (Fall, Winter, Spring). Data is used for IEP Notes, to inform instruction and show progress.
